We have an established tradition of high profile status for PE and Sport at Malmesbury gaining 'Outstanding' for a subject inspection in 2011. Our pupil premium only covers part of what we spend on PE as a whole. The school achieved the 'Sainbury's Gold Award' in July 2016.

The school was given an award for sporting achievement by the School Games in June 2016. This was for increasing competitive sporting opportunities at school through the School Games. The School Games is supported by a range of partners including the Department for Culture, Media and Sport, Sport England, Youth Sport Trust, Department of Health and British Paralympic Association.



Vision

All pupils leaving primary school will be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.
